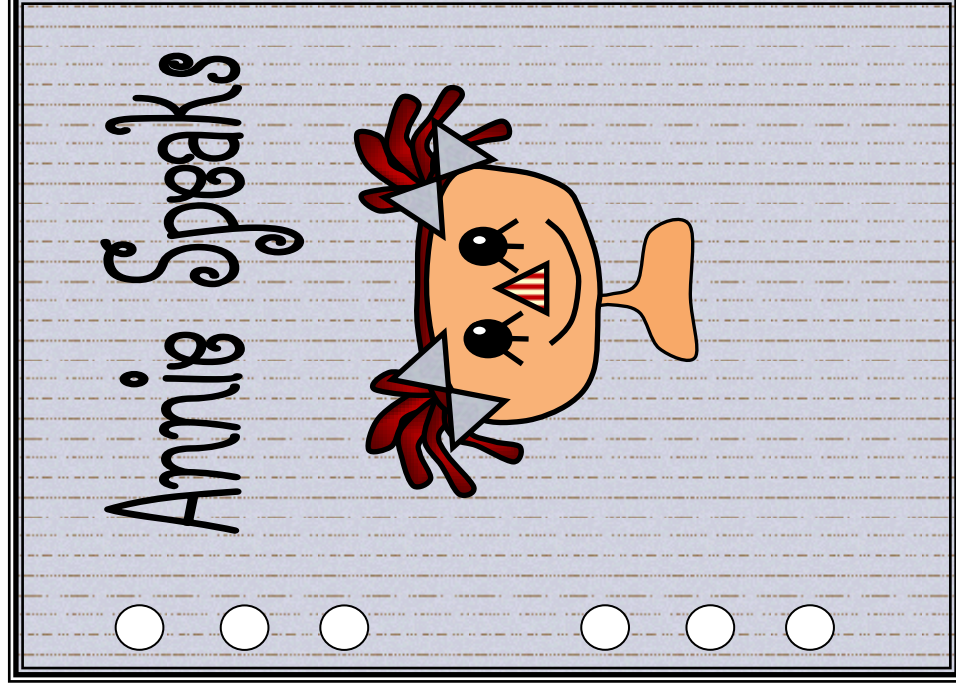

Read through all directions before beginning.

Create a journal for yourself that is guaranteed and specifically designed to lift your spirits and create a personal comfort zone by a "feeling better" about myself attitude.

For your journal cover and pages; you will be a needin:

- Copy/printer paper for journal pages, or if you like a better grade; it's strictly up to you
- Card stock or something thicker for the cover
- Printer (of course) to print off your journal

To bind your journal; you will be a needin:

- Tooth floss or waxed beading string; just make sure it's waxed
- large-eye darning/sewing/embroidery needle

Directions:

Here are the two templates you will need for your journal. Print the cover off on card stock and the pages on 20 pound paper or, if you prefer, plain ole regular copy/printer paper. Print off as many pages as you like; don't forget to print on the backs also.

To bind, measure the length of the book and times that by 2-1/2 or 3. Cut off a length of waxed floss or waxed beading string to this length. Thread one end onto the needle being sure to leave a nice long tail (for tying). Take the needle in and out of the holes pulling tightly after each to make sure the "thread" is taught. When you get to the top, go back down and when you get back down to the bottom, tie off the thread and hide the knot by pushing it into one of the holes.

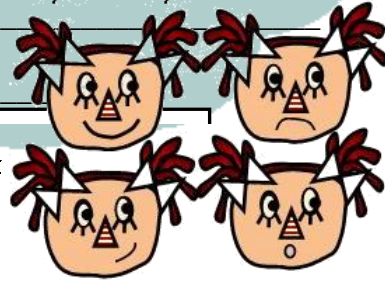

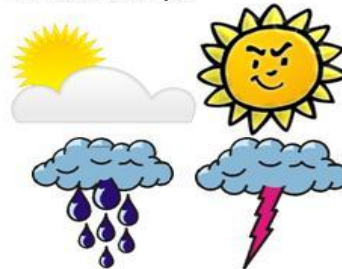
