Approximately 19 inches tall

You Will Need:

Material: Muslin, yellow, white, scraps of green
Stuffing

Embroidery Floss: Black, red, ecru

Paint: Sunflower yellow, antique white, white, black, barn red
Doll needle (3 or 5 inches long)

Card stock

Two 1/2 inch white buttons (for shoes)

Two 1/2 inch black matte buttons (for doll eyes)

Chili: prim doll hair (prim gal on ebay)

Small paint brushes

Stencil brush (for cheeks)

Misc: Wood or plastic ruler, 20 gauge wire, yellow wash cloth, brown wreath wire, cheesecloth, hot glue gun and glue sticks, pliers (optional), white ric-rac, mechanical pencil

Rusting: White vinegar, peroxide, salt, paper towels, sprits bottle, large plastic container.

Staining: Instant coffee, vanilla extract, fragrance oil. Optional for staining:
Old cookie sheet, rags, wax paper, glass jar with lid.

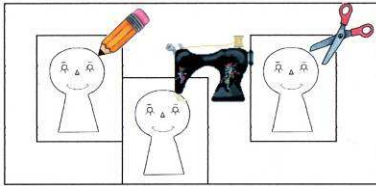
Approx. 19 inches tall, doll approx. 10 inches tall,

Read through all directions before beginning.

Body:

#1. Body: On doubled material, with a disappearing fabric marking g pen, lightly trace completely around body patterns. Sew directly on the traced lines; leave open where indicated. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines. Clip curves and turn. Stuff head and body firmly and sew opening closed.



#2. Stuff arms and legs to stuffing line (indicated on pattern) firmly. Sew openings closed. Attach arms where indicated on pattern. Legs are not attached yet as they need painted.

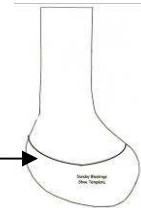
#3. The next step is staining the head/body and arms with the recipe and instructions given at the end of these directions. Do NOT stain the legs.



Paint Legs/Shoes:

Legs: Attach a piece of thread to top of legs (for hanging to dry). To whitewash; mix 1/3 cup water and 1 Tablespoon white paint in a glass jar with a lid. Shake until mixed thoroughly. Paint entire leg and hang to dry.

Shoes: Print out shoe template and shoe strap template. Position (see illustration & pattern) and pin to feet with straight pins. With a mechanical pencil, draw outline of shoes (the top part of template only) & strap... With a small paint brush, first outline top of shoes and then fill in; do the same for the strap. Hang to dry once again. Note: I hang mine on a wire hanger and hang in my garage so that possible drippings from the paint won't cause any damage to carpet. Sand lightly. Glue buttons in place (see picture) on straps.



Face:

#1. Eyes: Print and cut out the eyes (in pattern section). Position these on the face where you want them and pin them to the face with straight pins. Very lightly trace around these with a mechanical pencil; use a mechanical pencil as it leaves a thinner line than a regular pencil. If using a regular pencil, your lines will be thicker therefore when you paint the eyes in they will be larger than the pattern. With a very small brush and using your black acrylic paint, very slowly outline eyes first and then fill in. Once that has dried, using the end of a very narrow small paint brush, dip it lightly in the antique white paint and gently dot on the whites of her eyes (see picture for placement).

#2. Mouth: Thread your 3-inch doll needle with 1 strand of your brown embroidery thread. Going in at the very top of her head (this will be covered up with her hair) embroider the mouth using a simple backstitch.

#3. Nose: Print and cut out nose pattern. Position on face and pin using straight pins. Very lightly trace around this with a mechanical pencil. Using a double strand of red embroidery thread go in from the top of the head (as in step #2), use satin stitch for the nose. If unsure of the satin stitch, visit my "Stitch 'n' Stuff" page for an illustration. Tip - I usually unthread my doll needle here and rethread on a smaller, sharper needle.

#4. Eyebrows & Eyelashes: With a mechanical pencil and using the picture as a pattern, trace in eyelashes. Tip - use a ruler. Thread your doll needle with a single strand of brown embroidery thread and use the same technique as in step #2 backstitch the eyelashes; do the same for the eyebrows.

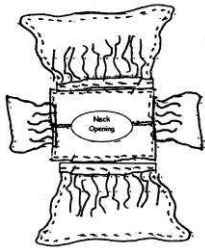
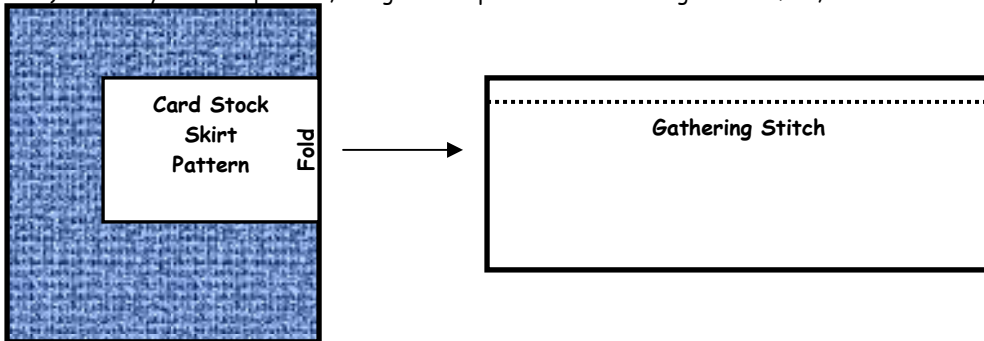
#5. Cheeks: Dip some Barnyard Red paint onto a paper plate. Dip your stencil brush lightly into the paint and pounce off most of it onto the paper towels. Unless you want her cheeks very bright, be sure to pounce off MOST of the paint. If her cheeks are not colorful enough for you, you can always add more...but begin by applying only a small amount. With your stencil brush and checking picture on pattern for placement of cheeks, in a circling motion, paint on cheeks.

Hair:

- #1. Cut 34 pieces of hair 10 inches long and 6 pieces of hair 5 inches long.
 - #2. Thread your large-eyed needle with one piece of a 10-inch piece of hair.
 - #3. Insert it along the side of the head, from one "x" to the next "x", and pull completely through. There should be 17 along each side of the head
 - #4. Do the same for the bangs; there should be 6 placed of the 6-inch pieces of hair along the front of her head, as marked on pattern with an "xx". Tie and knot each piece of hair.
- NOTE: You may need a pair of pliers to help with this.

Dress:

- #1. Bodice - On double layer material, right sides together, pin bodice pattern and cut out, being sure to place the bodice on the fold as indicated. Cut out opening for head.
- #2. Skirt - On doubled layer material, right sides together, pin an 8-1/2 x 11 piece of paper (card stock may work better) which is your skirt pattern, being sure to place the smaller edge on the fold, and cut out.

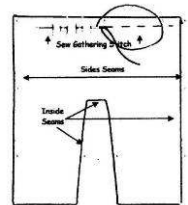


- #3. Doing front and back separately, take one piece of the cut out skirts and sew a gathering or a running stitch about 1/4" away from one long edge.
- #4. Gather that part of the skirt and with right sides together match it to the bottom of the bodice. Pin & sew right above the gathering stitch.
- #5. Do the same for the other side of the bodice.
- #6. With right sides together, match up the front and back dress pieces and, using 1/4 inch seam allowance, sew together.
- #7. Turn hem under 1 inch and pin; position zig-zag trim and pin. Sew. Trim excess.
- #8. Turn bottom of sleeves up about 1/2 inch and hand sew.

- #9. Slip dress on over doll's head. Hand stitch a running stitch completely around neck and pull to gather, knot.

Bloomers:

- #1. On doubled material, trace pattern with mechanical pencil being sure to place on fold where indicated. Sew on traced lines, outside as well as inside seams. Cut out about 1/4 inch from sewn lines. Clip curves and turn.
- #2. Turn waistline down 1/4 inch and hem.
- #3. Stain with recipe and instructions given below at the end of these directions.
- #4. One inch up from bottom of each leg, with matching embroidery thread, run a gather stitch around. Pull to gather.
- #5. Run a gathering stitch around waistline and pull to gather.



Hair Bow:

- #1. Print and cut out hair bow pattern. Trace on wrong side of double material; do NOT cut out.
- #2. Sew on traced lines; do NOT leave an opening. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines.
- #3. In the center of the back of the bow, cut a small slit for turning. Clip curves, turn, press.
- #4. Hand sew a gathering stitch in the very center of the bow vertically and pull to gather. Secure.
- #5. Either sew or glue to head.

Doll:

Head/Body:

- #1. Print out all body pieces including head, body, arm and leg patterns.

- #2. **Head:** On double muslin, with a mechanical pencil, trace pattern; sew directly on traced lines, do NOT leave an opening. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines. On back center, about 1 inch up cut a small slit for turning. Turn. Press. Stuff firmly and sew opening closed.
- #3. **Body, arms and legs:** On double muslin, with a mechanical pencil, trace patterns (1 body, 2 arms and 2 legs); sew directly on traced lines being sure to leave open where indicated on patterns. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines. Clip curves and turn. Press. Stuff firmly, sew openings closed.
- #4. Stain with recipe and instructions given at the end of these directions.
- #5. Tilt head slightly to one side, and sew head to neck.
- #6. Attach arms where indicated on pattern.
- #7. **Legs:** Attach a piece of thread to top of each leg (to hang for drying). Paint shoes black and hang to dry. When completely dry, sand lightly.
- #8. Attach legs where indicated on pattern.

Face:

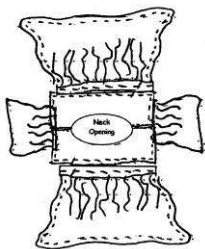
- #1. **Eyes:** With plastic or wooden ruler, trace in the eyelashes (1/2 inch each) and the eyebrows (1/2 inch each). Thread doll needle with single strand black embroidery thread. Going in from the center top of the head (this will be covered with her hair), go down and embroider the eyelashes and eyebrows. Sew buttons on for eyes.
- #2. **Nose:** Print and cut out nose pattern. Position on face where desired and pin in place using straight pins. Very lightly trace around this with a mechanical pencil. Using 2 strands of red embroidery thread go in from the top of the head and embroider the nose with a satin stitch. Tip - I usually unthread my doll needle here and rethread on a smaller, sharper needle.
- #3. **Mouth:** With plastic or wooden ruler, trace the mouth (1/2 inch). Thread your 3-inch doll needle with a single strand of black embroidery thread. Going in at the very top of her head (this will be covered up with her hair) embroider the mouth.
- #4. **Cheeks:** Dip your stencil brush into barn red paint and pounce off most of the paint onto a paper towel. Unless you want her cheeks very bright, be sure to pounce off MOST of the paint. If her cheeks are not colorful enough for you, you can always add more...but begin by applying only a small amount. With your brush and checking picture on pattern for placement of cheeks, swirl on cheeks.

Hair:

- #1. Cut 4 pieces of hair each 5 inches long and 2 pieces 3 inches long.
- #2. Insert a piece of matching embroidery thread in the 3 places as indicated on pattern.
- #3. Lay the 4 pieces of hair that are 5 inches long across head, in the center of the pieces of matching embroidery thread, on top of this, in the very center, lay the 2 pieces that are 3 inches long, and tie tightly. Trim.
- #4. Print out hair bow pattern; trace on double layer material and cut out.
- #5. Fashion into a bow and either sew or glue to head.

Dress:

- #1. **Bodice** - On double layer material, right sides together, pin bodice pattern and cut out, being sure to place the bodice on the fold as indicated.
- #2. **Skirt** - On doubled layer material, right sides together, pin the skirt pattern, being sure to place on fold where indicated, and cut out.



- #3. Doing front and back separately, take one piece of the cut out skirts and sew a gathering or a running stitch about 1/4" away from one long edge.
- #4. Gather that part of the skirt and with right sides together match it to the bottom of the bodice. Pin & sew right above the gathering stitch.
- #5. Do the same for the other side of the bodice.
- #6. With right sides together, match up the front and back dress pieces and, using 1/4 inch seam allowance, sew shoulder, underarm, and side seams.
- #7. Turn hem under about 1/4 inch, pin. Cut a piece of zig-zag trim and pin to front of dress directly over hem you just pinned. Sew hem.

- #8. Turn sleeves under 1/4 inch and hem.
- #9. Stain with recipe and instructions given below at the end of these directions. Dry thoroughly. Press.
- #10. Hand sew a gathering stitch completely around neck, pull to gather and secure in back.

Bloomers:

- #1. On doubled material, trace pattern with mechanical pencil being sure to place on fold where indicated. Sew on traced lines, outside as well as inside seams. Cut out about 1/4 inch from sewn lines. Clip curves and turn.
- #2. Turn waistline down 1/4 inch and hem.
- #3. Stain with recipe and instructions given below at the end of these directions.
- #4. One inch up from bottom of each leg, with matching embroidery thread, run a gather stitch around. Pull to gather.

#5. Run a gathering stitch around waistline and pull to gather.

Daisy Flower:

- #1. Print and cut out daisy pattern as well as daisy center pattern.
- #2. On double white material, trace daisy pattern with mechanical pencil, do NOT cut out.
- #3. Sew directly on traced lines, do NOT leave an opening. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines.
- #4. Cut a small "x" slit in the center back of daisy for turning. Clip curves and turn.
- #5. Stuff firmly and sew opening shut.
- #6. On double yellow washcloth, trace daisy center pattern, do NOT cut out.
- #7. Sew directly on traced lines, do NOT leave an opening. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines.
- #8. On back, cut an "x" slit for turning, turn.
- #9. With a double strand of matching yellow embroidery thread, sew center to daisy going around the very outside; when you have about an inch left to sew, stuff the center and finish sewing the center to the daisy.
- #10. Mix equal parts of water and instant coffee and coat entire flower; let dry. (This will give it a very dark stain which will help with the vintage appeal.)
- #11. Paint petals antique white; 2 coats. When thoroughly dry, sand lightly.
- #12. Paint center sunflower yellow; 2 coats. When thoroughly dry, sand lightly.
- #13. Cut a 12-inch piece off of the wreath stem wire and push stem up into hole previously sewn shut, glue in place.
- #14. Print and cut out daisy flower leaf pattern. Trace on single layer green material and cut out. Tie around stem directly under flower, glue in place.

Bee:

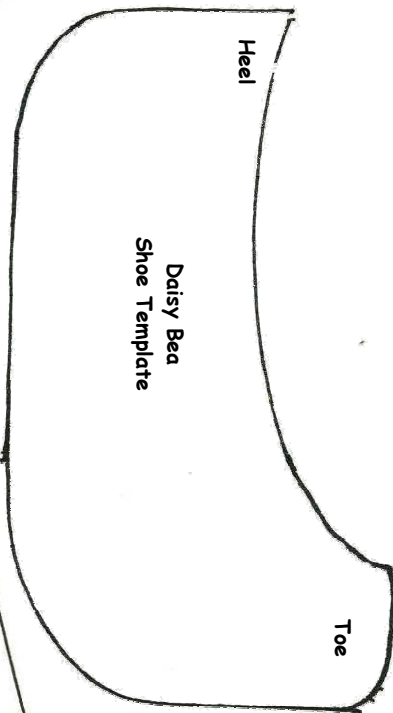
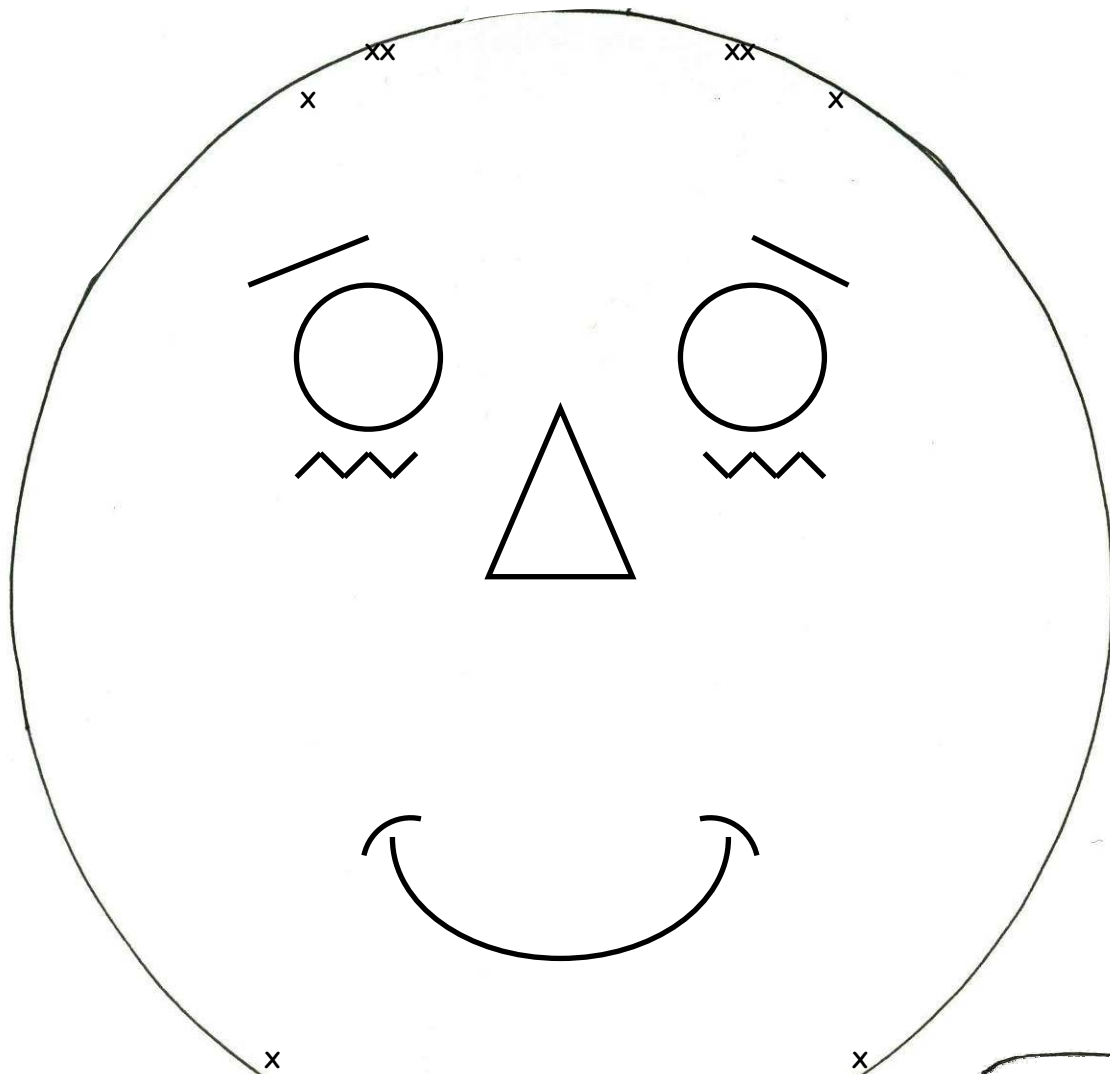
- #1. Print and cut out bee pattern.
- #2. Trace on double muslin with mechanical pencil; sew on traced lines. Do NOT leave an opening.
- #3. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines. Cut a slit in back of bee for turning. Clip curves and turn.
- #4. Stuff firmly and sew opening shut.
- #5. Attach a thread to one end of bee (to hang for drying).
- #6. Paint entire bee yellow, hang to dry.
- #7. When thoroughly dry, paint head black and paint on small black stripes on body of bee. Hang to dry. Paint a second coat if needed.
- #8. When thoroughly dry, sand lightly.
- #9. Print and cut out cheesecloth bee wing pattern and trace on single layer cheesecloth. Stain with recipe and instructions given at the end of these directions. Cut in half, lay one piece on top of the other and with a piece of ecru embroidery thread tie in the center. Glue this center to center of bee (see picture).
10. Cut 2 pieces of wire each 3 inches long for antennas. With a pair of long nose pliers, curl the end of each slightly. Stick the other end into some glue and push into head. If you have a problem pushing it into the head, take a large needle and push it in and out several times and then stick the wire in.
- #11. Position on flower (see picture) and glue in place.

Staining: Combine $\frac{1}{4}$ cup instant coffee, 2 cups hot water, 2 Tablespoons Vanilla extract and $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon fragrance oil (Some of my preferred scents are cinnamon bun, sugar cookies, and vanilla) in a glass jar with lid. Shake for few minutes until thoroughly mixed. (See the supply list on back of pattern cover for some suggested places for purchasing fragrance oils.) If the scent is not strong enough for your preference, add another 1/8 teaspoon of fragrance oil and continue this until the scent is to your liking. However, I would suggest only adding 1/8 teaspoon of fragrance oil each time because if you add too much and the scent is too strong for you, you will have to start over. Line an old cookie sheet with old rags and lay what you are staining here. With a sponge brush, thoroughly coat it. Bake for 10 minutes at 200 degrees. Check often as this can catch on fire. If you have to bake longer, only bake at 5 minute increments and always KEEP checking the oven.

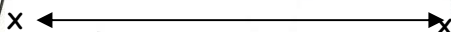

Head/Body Pattern

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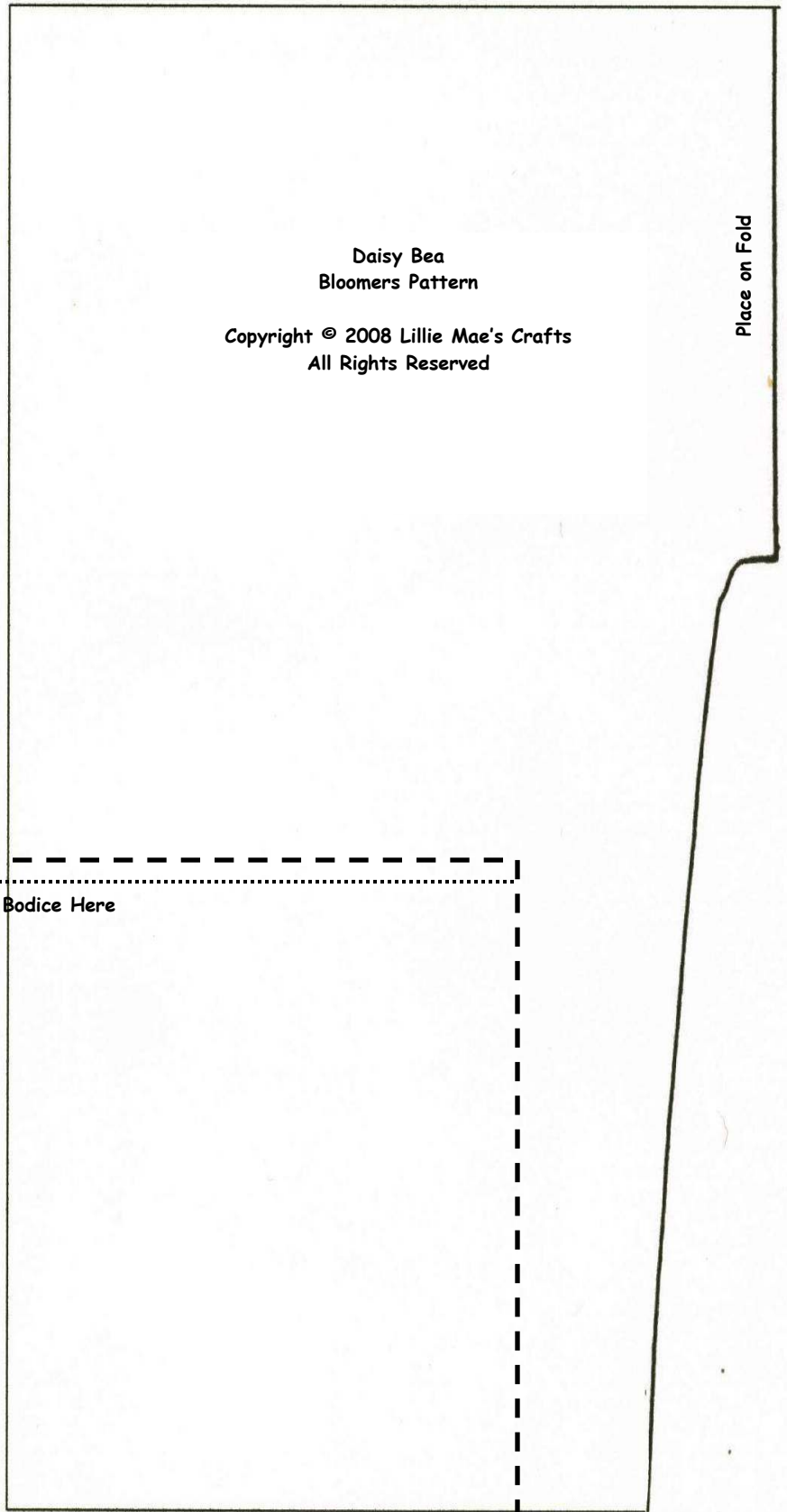

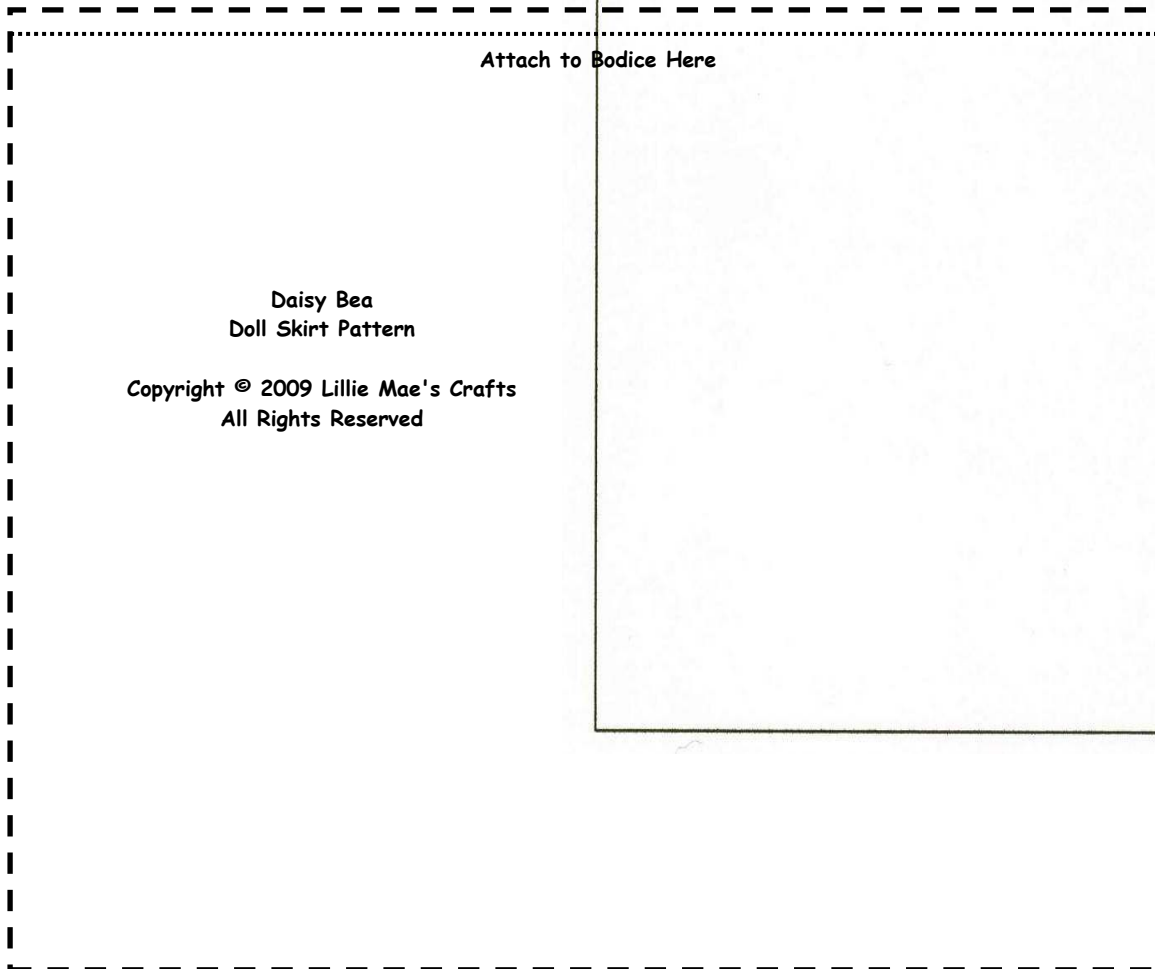

Attach Skirt Here



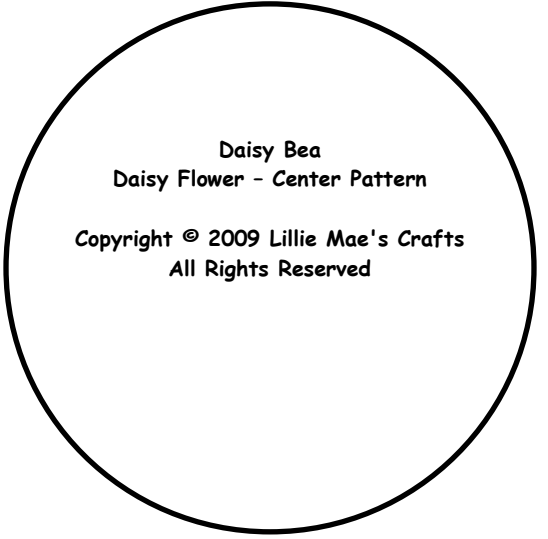
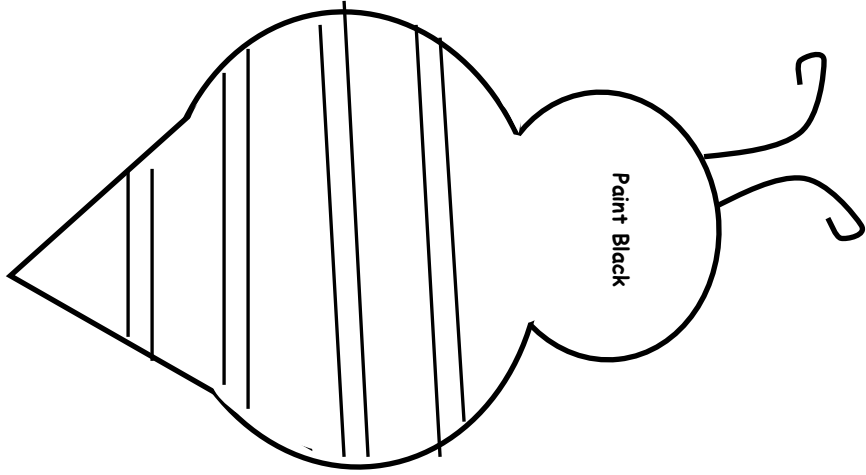
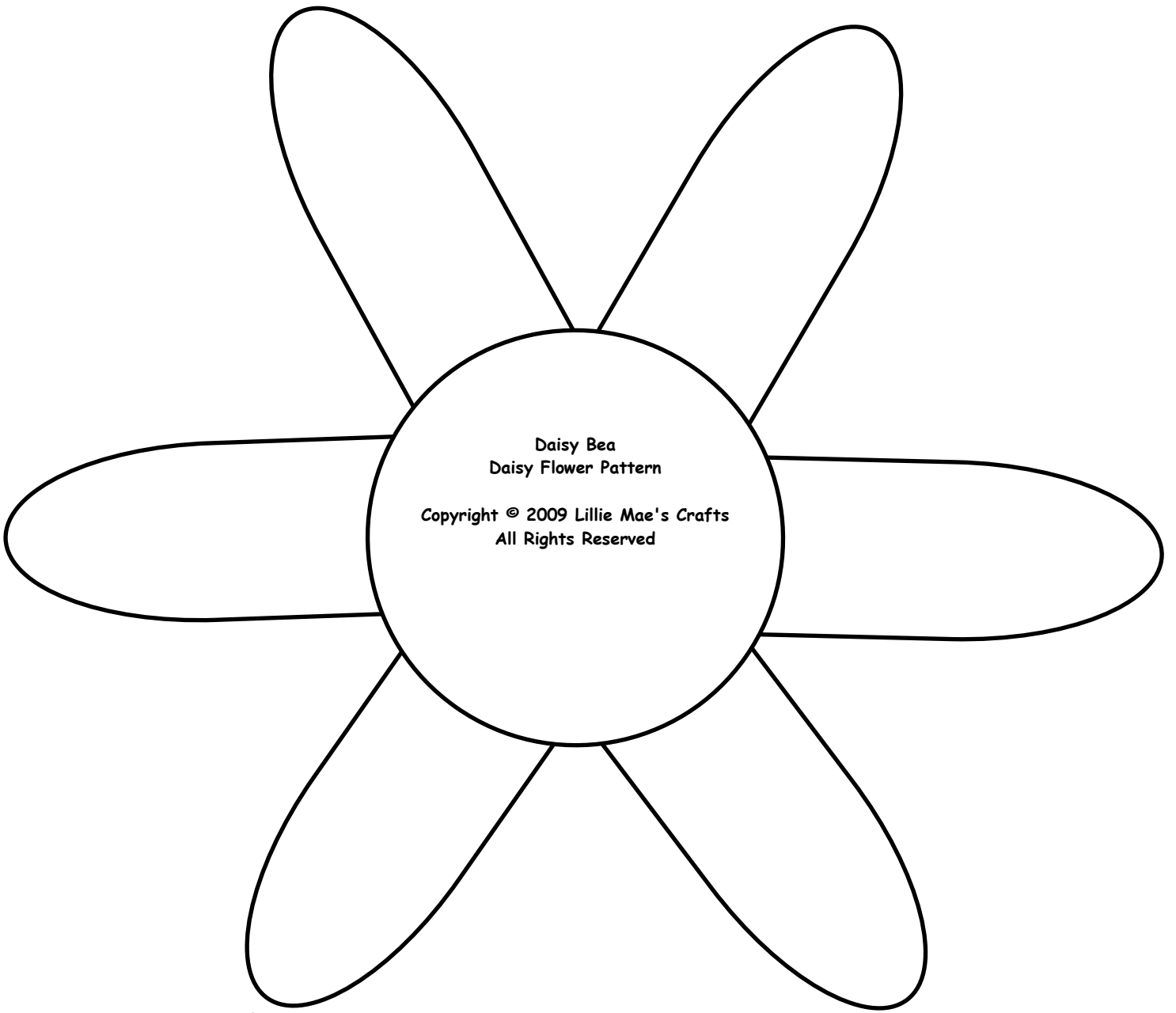
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Bloomers Pattern
